The Invitation to the Table

One: We have all fallen short of the glory of God. We have hurt and been hurt, broken and been broken, alienated and been alienated, wronged and been wronged, sinned and been sinned against.

This is not a Presbyterian table – it is for all members of the church universal. This is not a table only for adults – children may partake in the Sacrament with proper guidance from those around them. This is not a table for those who have not sinned – for no one would eat.

All: We come to this table, not because we must, but because we may. We come to testify not that we are righteous, but that we sincerely love our Lord Jesus Christ and desire to be his true disciples. We come, not because we are strong, but because we are weak. We come to this table, not because of any goodness of our own, but because we need God's mercy and help. We come to this table not to testify that we are righteous, but to sincerely declare that we love God.

One:. Beloved Children of God, come to the table of our Lord. All are welcome here...

The Great Thanksqiving and the Lord's Prayer

One: The Lord be with You All: And also with you. One: Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them up to the Lord.
One: Let us give our thanks and praise!

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise!

One: It is truly right and our greatest joy to give thanks and praise, O God our creator and redeemer. In your wisdom, you made all things and sustain them by your power. You formed us in your image to love and serve you, but we forgot your promises and abandoned your commandments. In your mercy, you did not reject us but still claimed us as your own.

Therefore we lift our hearts in joyful praise, joining our voices with choirs of angels, and with all the faithful of every time and place, who forever sing to the glory of your name:

All:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest, hosanna in the highest.

One: Pour out your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these your gifts of bread and the cup, that the bread we break and the cup we bless may be the communion of the body and blood of Christ. As this bread is Christ's body for us, send us out to be the body of Christ in the world.

Lord in your mercy and righteousness hear our prayers for:

One: Through Christ, with Christ, in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor are yours almighty God. We pray these things in the name of your Son who taught us to pray together saying:

All: Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name.
Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, On earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread; And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors; And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory, forever. Amen.
