



Forget how to change your online gift? See below:

- 1) Go to mechpresby.org and click "Give" and then "Give Now" in the pull-down menu.
- 2) If you already have an account, on the top right-hand corner, click "Sign In".
- 3) Use your email address and password to sign in. Please note, the MPC office does not have this information.
- 4) Once logged in, click on "Giving" on the left-hand side of the screen.
- 5) Your current pledge should show up on the screen. To increase your amount, click on the 3 dots on the right-hand side (...) and then choose "Edit."
- 6) This will give you access to your current pledge donation so that you can easily add \$5 more per week.

April Spiritual Retreat


